



Changes to Noise Ordinance Effective October 20, 2016

Did you know that there are two significant changes to the Town’s Noise Ordinance? Currently, building and landscaping contractors are allowed to perform work which makes noise beginning at 7:30 am. The first change for the new regulations does not permit any noise before 9:00 am to allow residents more quiet time in the morning. A second change clarifies that homeowners/renters may have contracted landscapers and/or construction contractors working on their property performing work which makes noise on Saturdays from 9:00 am to noon. The homeowner/renter must be on site while work is occurring. Please note that garbage collection is not subject to the noise ordinance.

To help you understand these important changes, we have prepared a chart to illustrate the old noise standards and the new standards. If you have questions about the new ordinance requirements please call Town Hall at 707-944-8851. To report a noise ordinance violation please call Town Hall during business hours (8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday-Friday) or the Yountville Sheriff’s Office at 707-944-9228 after hours and weekends. It is important to call Town Hall or the Sheriff’s Department while the noise is occurring so that we can document the situation and work with the violator to resolve the situation.

Election – November 8, 2016

The Election Code allows the Town Council to appoint Candidates that were nominated by registered voters when there are not more candidates than offices to be elected. At the noticed Town Council Special Meeting held August 23, 2016, Council unanimously adopted a resolution cancelling the election and appointing Marjorie Mohler and Jeffrey Durham to the 4-year terms and Kerri Dorman to the 2-year term. The persons appointed will be administered the Oath and take office at the December 6, 2016 Town Council meeting.

Avoid a clog and keep grease out of you drain! Did you know that certain types of Fats, Oils and Grease can clog your drain and sewer pipes? The best way to prevent these unwanted clogs is to pour all cooled cooking fats, oils and grease that will harden (bacon grease, meat drippings) into a waxed food container such as a milk carton or container with a lid and dispose of it in the garbage or your kitchen scrap recycling.
