Be Prepared for the Winter Storm Season

As we approach winter storm season, we want to make sure all residents are prepared and ready!
Resident Checklist for Winter Storms:

Have you:

- Cleaned your gutters and downspouts? With the leaves finally falling, this should be done on a regular basis as leaves accumulate.
- Checked to make sure your vehicle windshield wipers are in good working condition?
- Reviewed your insurance documents to see what is, and is not, covered?
- Programmed your phone to include all emergency numbers?
- Signed up for Nixle.com, a service that provides text message alerts? Signing up is easy, just visit www.nixle.com and follow the simple instructions.
- Installed the MYville App on your mobile or tablet device to report broken limbs, or leaves accumulated near storm drains. Search "MYville" on the Apple store or Google Play Store.



During the storm:

Turn Around, Don't Drown! Did you know that just 6 inches of moving water can knock you down, and 2 feet of water can sweep your vehicle away?

During periods of heavy rainfall: A sandbag station will be available at Yountville Community Park 24/7 and will operate on a self-serve basis only. Sign up for eNotifications on the Town's website to learn when this station is available!

Town Relaxes Water Conservation Requirements

Let's Keep Up the Good Work!

Beginning October 31, 2016, the Town will be relaxing water conservation guidelines from mandatory to voluntary efforts. To date, the Town has reduced consumption by 28.1% as compared to the 2013 benchmark. This is no small accomplishment – the success of the Town's water conservation is largely in part because residents and businesses took action by following (and often exceeding) the mandatory guidelines!

While the Town is relaxing conservation guidelines, residents and businesses are encouraged to keep up the good work! The Town held numerous public workshops and continues to offer the ever-popular "[Cash for Grass](#)" program and water efficient rebate programs.

Here are some other tips:

- ◆ With the rainy season approaching, turn off all sprinklers during time of excess rainfall.
- ◆ Use automatic shutoff nozzles on hoses used for hand watering and maintenance watering of lawns and fields.
