## **Fire Department Summary**

#### **Statistical Analysis**

The attached spreadsheet shows a total of 482 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	343
Public Assists:	23
Traffic Collisions:	38
Vehicle Fires:	1
Alarm Soundings:	41
Structure Fires:	12
Vegetation Fires:	3
Miscellaneous Fires:	0
Rescues:	0
Hazardous Conditions:	7
Tree/Power Lines Down:	13

Of the total 433 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	92 Calls
Veterans Home:	225 Calls
County Areas:	159 Calls
Napa City:	6 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume still continues to be medical emergencies.

## **Major Events**

### **Rolling Wood Dr. Structure Fire**

E12 assisted Napa City with extinguishing a fully involved garage that was attached to a single-family residents at 2524 Rolling Wood Drive.

### **Trower Ave. Fire**

E12 and T12 assisted Napa City with a commercial structure fire at Galpao Gaucho Brazilian Steak house on Trower Ave

### **Newell Circle Structure Fire**

E12 and T12 assisted Napa City with a fully involved double wide trailer with multiple exposures at 41 Newell Circle

The hands only CPR program is a great course that we are trying to get as many people as possible in county to attended so that if there is a Cardiac arrest emergency that they'll know how to respond to the situation appropriately.
