Statistical Analysis

The attached spreadsheet shows a total of 450 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	344
Public Assists:	15
Traffic Collisions:	30
Vehicle Fires:	0
Alarm Soundings:	26
Structure Fires:	12
Vegetation Fires:	7
Miscellaneous Fires:	1
Rescues:	1
Hazardous Conditions:	13
Tree/Power Lines Down:	2

Of the total 450 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	107 Calls
Veterans Home:	207 Calls
County Areas:	132 Calls
Napa City:	5 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume still continues to be medical emergencies.

Major Events

Bouchon Bakery Fire

On July 16th crews responded for a commercial structure at Bouchon Bakery. Upon arrival crews made entry to find a small fire in the back wall behind the kitchen stove. Fire was quickly extinguished with limited extension and crews began to overhaul the contents inside the wall to prevent further spread within the building.

Traffic collision with Vegetation Fire

The past quarter we have had multiple vehicle accidents throughout the county. However, one incident on August 31st had our units respond for a vehicle into a power pole. While traveling on Silverado Trail the vehicle drove up the embankment and hit the pole head on. The impact sheared the power pole and it slid down the embankment and onto the highway while pinning the vehicle on the side of the embankment. The impact also ignited the vegetation around the vehicle. Thanks to surrounding vineyards the fire was held to under an acre. The patient self-extricated with minor injuries. The patient was transported to the Queen of the Valley Hospital for treatment.

Medical Aid Monticello Road

On August 25th, the crew responded in Rescue 12 for a medical aid on Monticello Road for a patient who was approximately 200' down the steep embankment. The patient traveled down to gather some personal items and was unable to make it back to the roadway. Our crews incorporated our newest rescue tool, the Arizona Vortex, to assist with the rescue. The Arizona Vortex has multiple uses and was used as a high point in conjunction with our ropes to assist our rescuers with helping the patient back to top of the roadway.

Special Events

Movie In The Park

This summer has been another great round of movie nights here in Yountville. Our crews have been able to attend them all and have had a great time with all of the community members. The last movie night the crew assisted with BBQing hotdogs while watching the movie Pets. Movie Night is always fun and we enjoy interacting with the community. We're always happy to help at community events and look forward to the next one.

Public Safety Training

This quarter, crews at station 12, continued to visit local wineries and businesses for fire extinguisher training as well as CPR training. The crews conduct annual fire safety practices as well as fire extinguisher training to staff upon request. Fire Personnel also hosted a hands only CPR classes local businesses in case of an EMS emergency. Hands only CPR is training for the public to render aid to someone needing CPR and can give the public the basic knowledge and confidence to act and begin care before any EMS personnel can arrive.

We also participated with National Night Out on August 1st in Napa's South Market Center. National Night Out is an annual event held for all local first responders to come together and share their specific tasks with the public. First responders include city, county, and state fire; city police, sheriff, and CHP; and EMS.

Training

Urban Shield

On September 10th Rescue 12 staffed with the Napa County Technical Rescue team deployed to Livermore for their annual disaster training drill. This is a large scale drill that tests the readiness and skills of many bay area rescue teams on scenarios such as confined space, collapsed structure rescue, High Angle technical rope rescue, and heavy vehicle lifting and stabilization. Our team from Station 12 and nearby stations placed first place at this years event.


Trainings

During the last quarter the crew have been busy with multiple trainings. We continue to train with our local volunteer companies from Rutherford and Dry Creek and our Explorers. Explorers are high school kids that are looking to make firefighting a career. This quarter trainings included MCI/Triage Treatment and Packaging, Fire Extinguishers, Traffic Incident Management, Forcible Entry, and OB Emergencies. We also assisted with our late rehire academy to hire new seasonal firefighters for those who left to return to school or other priorities. Our crews had their annual readiness drills that test their skills in various tasks with structure fire and wildland fire scenarios.

Safety Message

October is fire prevention month and we encourage you to take a moment to test your smoke detectors and practice escape routes in the home. We are always available for assistance with smoke detectors or any fire prevention assistance.
