Statistical Analysis

The attached spreadsheet shows a total of 428 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency calls in the town of Yountville are as follows:

Medical Aids:	210
Public Assists:	14
Traffic Collisions:	33
Vehicle Fires:	1
Alarm Soundings:	16
Structure Fires:	3
Vegetation Fires:	4
Miscellaneous Fires:	3
Rescues:	0
Hazardous Condition:	6
Tree/Power Lines Down:	22

Of the total 401 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	73 Calls
Veterans Home:	217 Calls
County Areas:	119 Calls
Napa City:	2 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past-history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies, however we have seen a rise in fire alarms this quarter.

Major Events

October Wind Event

On the night of October 8th, 2017, Station 12's crew as well as the residents of Yountville, Napa County, Sonoma County, and Solano County experienced a true phenomenon. A wind event that came through the different Counties in the Northern Bay were calculated at sustained 75 MPH with gusts up over 90 MPH. The winds along with the dry conditions created a true fire storm and devastation to our community. Our crews at Station 12 along with the Napa County Volunteers and many other of our cooperators including Law Enforcement were pushed to the limit. Our community has shown great determination and pride and have shown great support for one another as we move forward from this event. We all will not forget that devastating night and the many weeks that followed, but we are recovering and will rebuild.

Southern California Fires

Just as we were still dealing with the aftermath of the fires in Northern California, fires in Southern California began. A few members from the Yountville Station went to Southern California, while the others stayed behind and covered the vacancies left from the crews around the county who went down to support the fire fight.

Special Events

Toy Drive

This year the firefighters at Yountville along with the help and generosity of the community conducted another successful toy drive. The drive continues to grow year after year as the number of needy families increase. As part of the toy drive the Yountville firefighters make multiple trips throughout the county to locations like the Los Niño's Child Development Centers located in Napa. The centers are home to children of low-income families who need affordable child care. The Fire Station also had toys that were donated set up for families to come by and choose toys for their families. Families selected for the toys go through a screening process that is overseen by Fire Captain Matt Newberry and the Town of Yountville Parks & Recreation department's Jennifer Carvalho.

Community Tree Lighting

Santa's sleigh was in for repairs so Truck 12 gave him a lift to the annual Festival of Lights. As always the town looked great for the holiday season and station 12 added some extra lights and decorations this year as well. Firefighters collected toys for the toy drive, served hot chocolate and cookies, and provided fire prevention material to community members and kids.

Fun Run

The firefighters at the station participated with the Elementary class for fun run. They gave them tips on exercising, running, and staying active. It always a great time and the firefighters always enjoy participating and spending time with the kids.

Volunteer Academy

In January, the county will kick off another Napa County Volunteer Fire Academy. The program takes candidates selected to be volunteers in the county and trains them on the fundamentals of fire, rescue and EMS operations. The pool of students comprises recruits from the nine volunteer stations located throughout the county of Napa. Once completed with the training program the recruits will be assigned to their respective stations where they will respond to emergency incidents.
