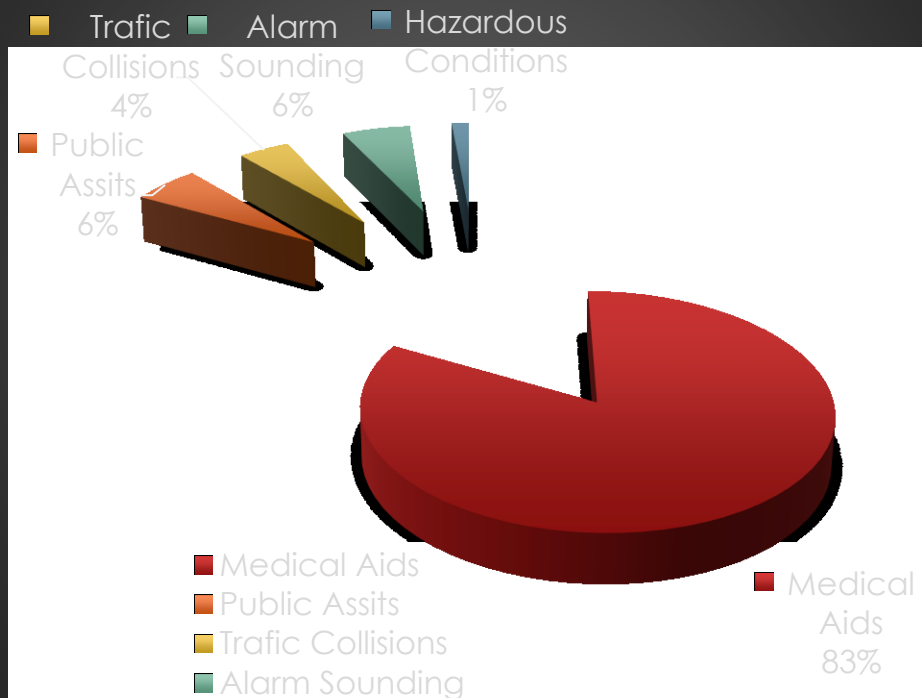

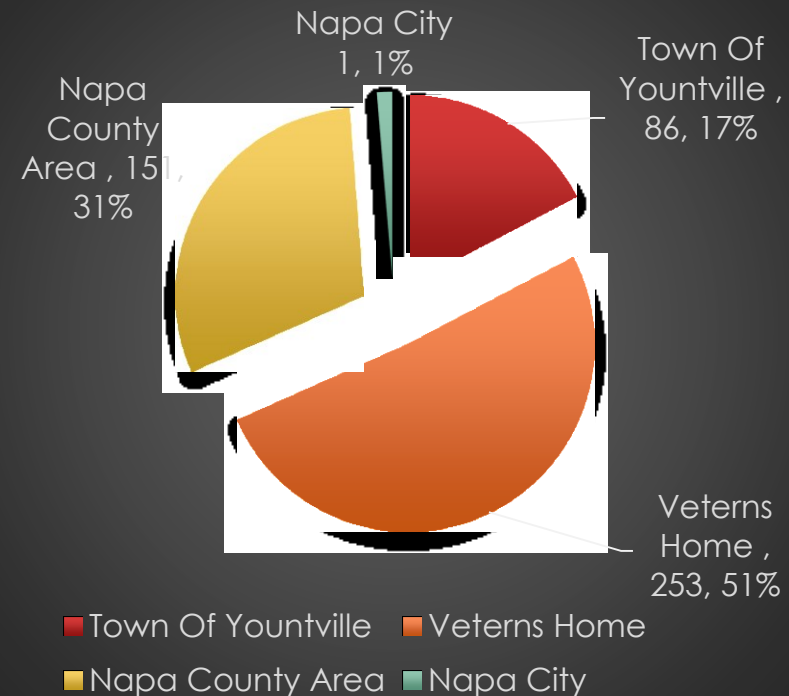

Town of Yountville Statistical Analysis



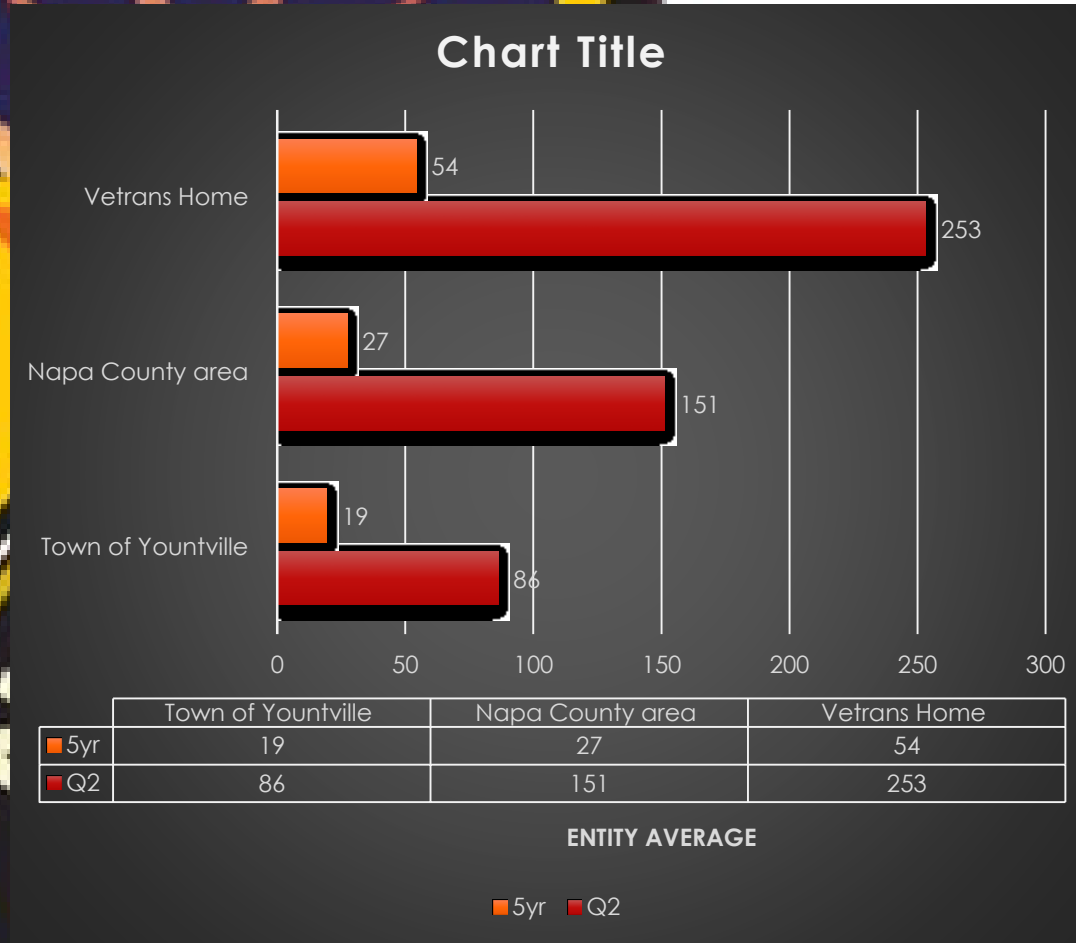
Total Call Volume



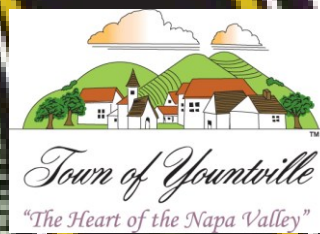

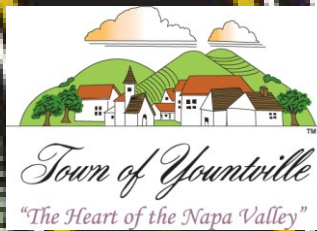

Statistical Analysis

The attached spreadsheet shows a total of 496 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdown of emergency calls for station 12 are as follows:

Medical Aids:	346
Public Assists:	16
Traffic Collisions:	46
Vehicle Fires:	2
Alarm Soundings:	50
Structure Fires:	20
Vegetation Fires:	2
Miscellaneous Fires:	0
Rescues:	5
Hazardous Conditions:	9
Tree/Power Lines Down:	0

Of the total 496 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	86 Calls
Veterans Home:	253 Calls
County Areas:	151 Calls
Napa City:	6 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies.

Major Events

Structure Fires

It was a quarter for the Firefighters a Station 12. Apparatus responded to Napa City for Five structure fires.

Early April, Engine 12 and Engine 212 responded to the Vintage Inn for the report of a fire. The fire was quickly extinguished by Station 12 staff minimizing damage.

May 19th Engine 12 and Truck 12 extinguished a structure fire at a home on Dry Creek Road.

On May 24th Engine and Truck 12 were some of the first units on scene at a structure fire at a home off Zinfandel Lane.

Traffic Collisions

Unfortunately, there were multiple major injury accidents along our highway the quarter. We like to remind everywhere to adhere to the speed limit and reduce distractions while driving.

Vets vs. Firefighters Softball

Academies

Station 12 personnel instructed and evaluated multiple firefighter participating in the Cal Fire Returnee Academy in addition to the annual Napa County Fire Department Volunteer Academy.

Fire Extinguisher Training

Station 12 Staff have had the privilege of instructing how to properly use a fire extinguisher at local wineries last quarter. The station has recently received a new live fire extinguisher training prop which allows for a safer and more productive training environment.

The ventilation training prop at the Napa County Fire Department Training Tower is near completion thanks training and Station 12 Staff whom have put a lot of time and effort into the project.
