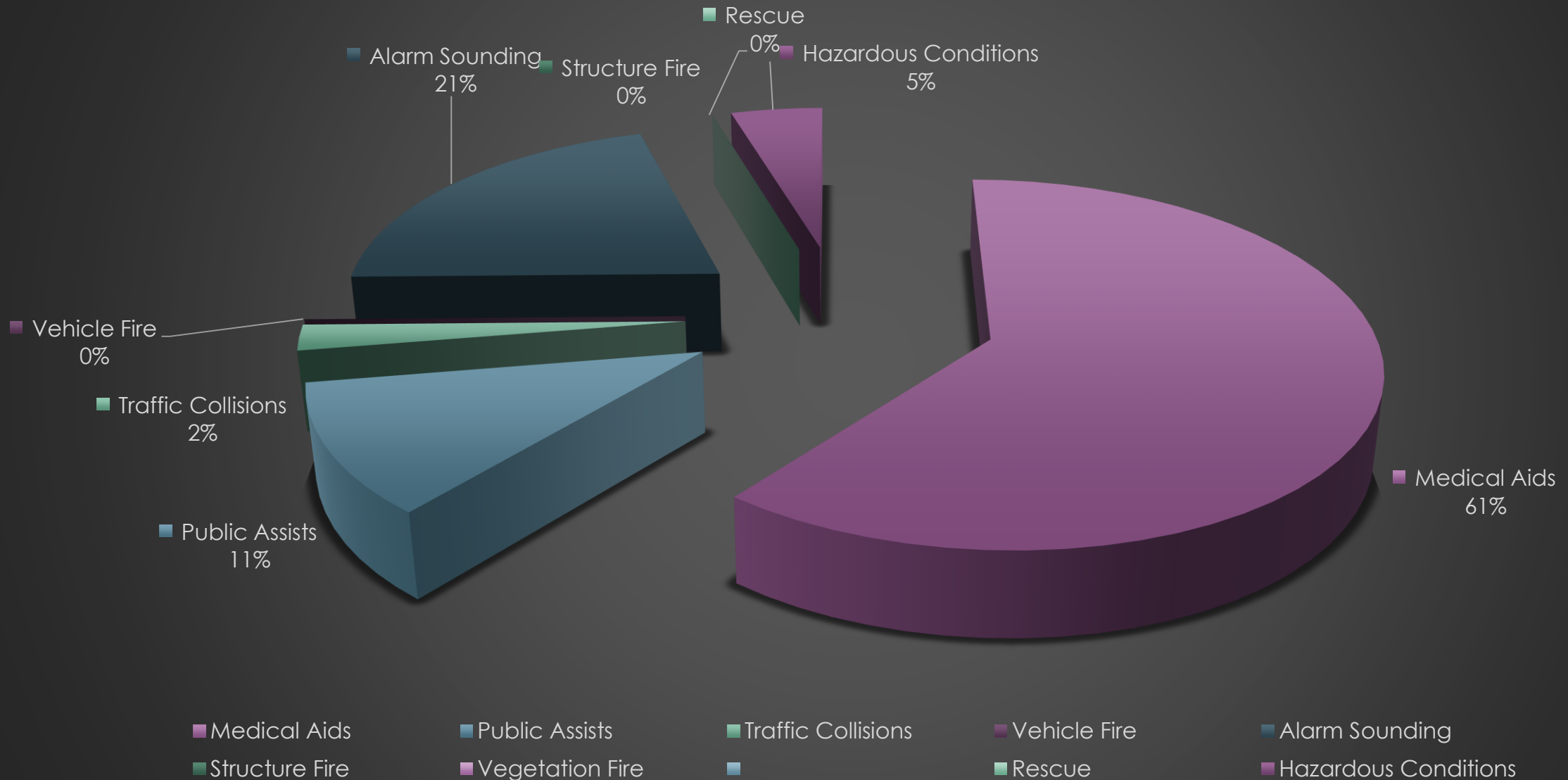

### **Statistical Analysis**

This quartered showed a total of 451 calls for the three-month period. This includes the total number of calls responded to by Yountville Station personnel. The breakdowns of emergency are as follows:

Medical Aids:	334
Public Assists:	13
Traffic Collisions:	35
Vehicle Fires:	0
Alarm Soundings:	44
Structure Fires:	7
Vegetation Fires:	3
Miscellaneous Fires:	0
Rescues:	7
Hazardous Condition:	8

Of the total 451 calls, the breakdown according to response area is as follows:

Town of Yountville:	87 Calls
Veterans Home:	250 Calls
County Areas:	112 Calls
Napa City:	2 Calls

These averages are mostly consistent with past-history and call analysis. As is typical with virtually all Fire Departments today, our largest call volume continues to be medical emergencies, however we have seen a rise in Tree and power lines down this quarter due to the fire activity.

## **Major Events**

### **Structure Fires:**

During the past three months Station 12 units responded to numerous structure fires throughout the county. Due to the quick response and good work from the crews, all the fires have been held to minor damage.

### **Vehicle Accidents:**

Engine 12 and Truck 12 continue to respond to an unfortunate amount of traffic collisions resulting in injuries and fatalities, this past quarter has been no exception. We would like to remind everyone to obey the speed limits, never drink and drive and to pull over when tired.

### **Technical Rescue:**

In late October Rescue 12 responded to person entrapped in a grape harvesting machine on Monticello Rd Station 12 personnel assisted in the extrication of the victim.

## **Special Events**

### **Community Tree Lighting**

Santa's sleigh was in for repairs so Truck 12 gave him a lift to the annual Festival of Lights. As always the town looked great for the holiday season and station 12 added some extra lights and decorations this year as well. Firefighters collected toys for the toy drive, served hot chocolate and cookies, and provided fire prevention material to community members and kids.

### **Fun Run**

The firefighters at the station participated with the Elementary School class for a fun run. They gave them tips on exercising, running, and staying active. It always a great time and the firefighters always enjoy participating and spending time with the kids. Unfortunately, both Engine 12 and Truck 12 were dispatched to a traffic collision during the event, requiring them to leave early.

### **Alaina Housley Memorial**

Truck 12 was honored to attend and fly the United States flag for the young woman killed in Thousand Oaks, memorial service. All of us at Station 12 and Napa County Fire are sadden for any loss of a community member. We offer our condolences to her family.

### **Paradise Fire**

As many watched the events in Paradise on television, one of our members from station 12 who resides in Paradise lost his home in the fire while on duty. Fortunately, He and his wife had a plan. His wife was able to pack up what was important and make it to safety quickly. They are both doing great and expecting their first child soon.

### **Training:**

We are privileged to be stationed near the Napa County Training Grounds and always stay busy with training. Not only do we try to train daily on various topics with our crew at Station 12, we also have our monthly drills with the surrounding stations. We are tasked with a specific topic for each month and train with multiple other engine companies. This quarter's training included; our annual fire ground skills testing, supply




lines, hydraulics and pumping operations, and confined space. The Napa County Technical Rescue Team monthly drills consisted of breaking and breaching in a collapse scenario and shoring buildings for stabilization.

Personnel from the station instructed recruit firefighters for Napa City Fire on firefighter safety and survival. During all this Station 12 personnel continued to hone their skills by attending outside training including a forty-hour rope rescue technician course. Engineers Tom Lee and Sean Davis attended a three-week long ladder truck academy in Riverside at the Riverside County Fire training center. The Engineers were able to learn new techniques and tactics while refining their knowledge, skills and abilities as Truck Company members and officers.

We like to be involved within the community not only with special events but spreading knowledge and teaching fire prevention. This quarter we participated in multiple walk throughs with local businesses, wineries, and homes. Recently there have been a few remodels in the Town and we are learning the new layouts. A walk through of a building allows us to get to know the contents, fire detection systems, as well as layouts of the structure.

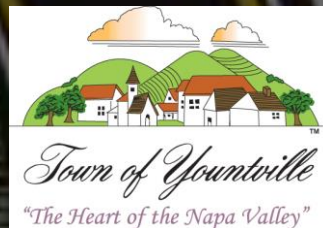
## **Volunteer Academy**

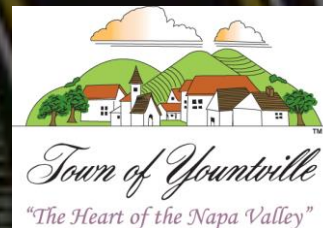

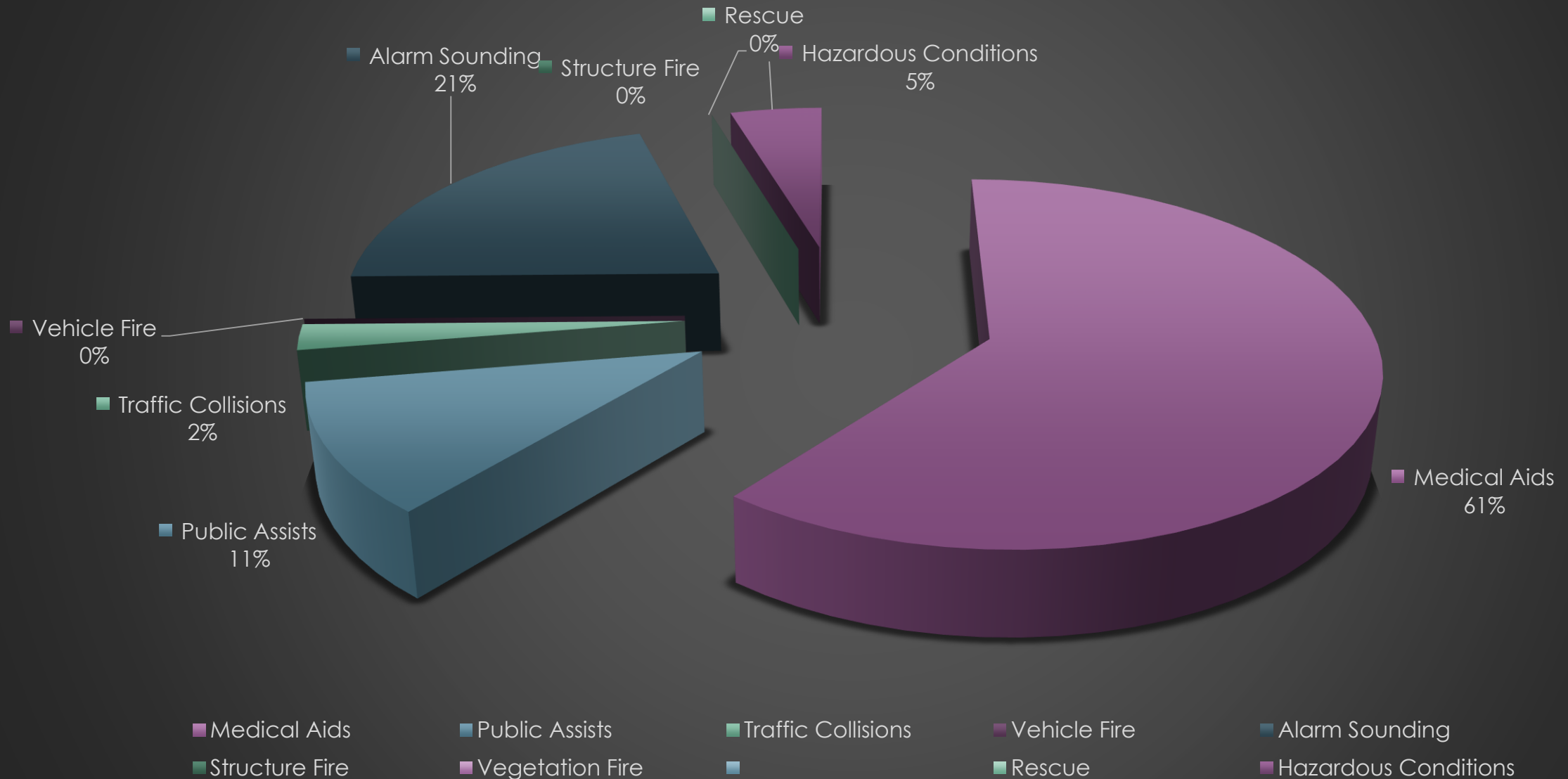
