

Executive Summary

We are requesting \$10,000 to support the Annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner, a longstanding tradition that fosters a sense of community in Yountville. This event is more than just a meal; it's an opportunity for neighbors to connect, share, and ensure no one spends the holiday alone. Homebound community members will receive meals to ensure the holidays are shared and celebrated. By delivering meals and hosting the event at our community center, we create a welcoming environment for everyone to participate in the spirit of Thanksgiving.

Since 2020, I have proudly contributed my expertise in hospitality to help make this dinner a success, and with your support, we can take it even further. This grant will allow us to broaden our reach, secure additional funding, and attract more donations, ensuring the event continues to grow and thrive. Additionally, we can use the funds to purchase supplies that will benefit other community events, creating a lasting impact throughout the year.

In this proposal, we outline the history of the dinner, the associated costs, and our plans to expand this effort to include a community Christmas dinner. Your generous contribution would play a vital role in making this vision a reality.

SMART Goals & Objectives

1. To support Residents of Yountville that can not travel or that have no local relatives or can not cook and need a healthy meal delivered for a holiday celebration
 - a. Serve 100 delivered Thanksgiving Meals
 - b. Serve 100 residents at a sit down holiday meal for Thanksgiving
2. Add an additional service for the December Holiday
 - a. Serve 50 delivered December Holiday Meals
 - b. Serve 50 residents at a sit down meals for the December Holiday
3. To provide an opportunity for residents to gather and celebrate with others in the community . Either via dining with others or as volunteers cooking , delivering or serving meals.
 - a. Meet goal attendance numbers
4. To provide an opportunity for Residents Volunteers to serve those in need especially to enrich the lives of our Senior Communities of Rancho de Napa, Bella Vista and the Seventh Day Adventists.
 - a. Rancho de Napa increase participation to 10 more
 - b. Seventh day Adventist increase participation to 15 more
 - c. Addition of outreach to Bella Vista add 10
 - d. Addition of Outreach to the Veterans home add 20

- e. Addition of those in town in need to 10 more
- 5. To provide a re-engagement of the Yountville Restaurants and Wineries in support of these meals.
 - a. Five Total restaurants to support our needs
 - b. Five Total tasting rooms to support our needs
- 6. To do outreach of support for December event food and volunteers.
 - a. Two New restaurant to support
 - b. Two New wineries to support our needs
- 7. To use sustainable practices for serviceware
 - a. Serve meals on China and use Linens that are reusable for the attended meal.
 - b. To serve delivered meals on compostable products.

Organizational Information

For over 20 years, the Annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner has been a cherished tradition, initially organized by the Native Sons and Daughters of the Golden West Napa Chapter. Later, Paul and Linda Moyer took the reins, collaborating with many talented chefs from Yountville to serve the community. In 2019, the dinner was missed, and the Rancho de Napa Social Club stepped in with a potluck, revealing that the need for this gathering still persisted, though relationships with chefs, hotels, and wineries had dwindled.

In 2020, Jeff Durham assumed leadership and adapted the event to the pandemic by providing pick-up meals. By 2022, the in-person dinner returned at the Community Center, with meal deliveries included. However, due to changes in restaurant management, COVID-related financial challenges, and a loss of chef partnerships, much of the cooking fell to Jeff and his dedicated team of volunteers.

We will continue to use the Kitchen facilities at the Community Center on Monday - Friday of Thanksgiving Week and will look at adding the week of the Christmas Holiday.

Needs Statement

Imagine a Thanksgiving where not just 140, but 200 of our community members, including those who live alone, enjoy a comforting, home-cooked meal. For years, we've served 60 people through meal delivery and hosted 80 for sit-down dinners. Time and time again, we've heard from neighbors who wish they had known about the program, showing us that the need for connection and care extends beyond our previous reach.

This year, we're aiming higher—to bring connection, a holiday meal, and the spirit of community to even more people. However, with the challenges of lost partnerships with local restaurants, hotels, and wineries, our ability to increase meals to 200 will require renewed support. We need more volunteers and the generosity of local businesses to ensure everyone gets a healthy, holiday meal.

We've already received heartwarming letters from those touched by past Thanksgiving events—both recipients and volunteers—testifying to the joy of delivering meals, offering warm wishes, and sharing a meal with neighbors. By supporting this effort, you're not just funding food—you're fueling a sense of belonging. For some, this could be the only opportunity to feel connected, as a simple meal delivery becomes a moment of kindness, and a shared table becomes a reminder that no one is truly alone.
