Signage in Yountville

Signage in Yountville is regulated by the Yountville Municipal Code. Many **businesses** have a master sign plan as part of their use permit. This means that the size, appearance, and number of signs a business is allowed is regulated by terms approved by the Town Council. Other businesses that do not have a master sign plan are regulated by the Municipal Code.

Often, signs are required for **activities and events**. If you are interested in obtaining sign permission for a **special event**, please contact the Planning & Building Department at (707) 944-8851 to speak with a planner.

Below are some frequently-asked questions about signage:

- My business requires a temporary sign. Can I put one up?
Yes, though temporary signage needs to be approved by a planner and may not remain in place longer than 90 days.
- Are A-frame signs allowed in Town?
A-frame signs are not allowed throughout Town except as approved for real estate open houses.
- Can I put up a sign for my garage sale?
Signs for garage sales, like other community signs, are allowed and do not require approval as long as the signs are placed in public bulletin board areas.
- Can I put up a political sign for the election?
Yes, temporary signs smaller than eight square feet are allowed on private property during the three months prior to an election, and for seven days following the election.
