Recycling Saves Resources

Recycling protects the environment and reduces the need to extract virgin materials, including oil — recycling one ton of plastic saves the equivalent of nearly 4 barrels of oil.

Recycling Saves Energy

Last year, over 140,000 tons of materials were recycled or composted at the Napa Recycling & Composting Facility. By keeping these valuable resources out of the landfill, we significantly decreased carbon dioxide and methane emissions and saved enough energy to power all the houses in Napa for three months!

Recycling Saves Jobs

Did you know that the recycling industry in California employs as many people (85,000) as the film industry? And, for every ton of material that is recycled, instead of wasted in incinerators and landfills, 10 times more jobs are created in recycling sorting, and 25 times more jobs are created in recycling manufacturing.

Recycling Saves Money

Recycling and compost collection is free with your residential service, and your monthly rate is determined by the size of your garbage container. The bigger your trash cart, the more you pay...save money by reducing your waste!

FOOD SCRAPS

YARD TRIMMINGS

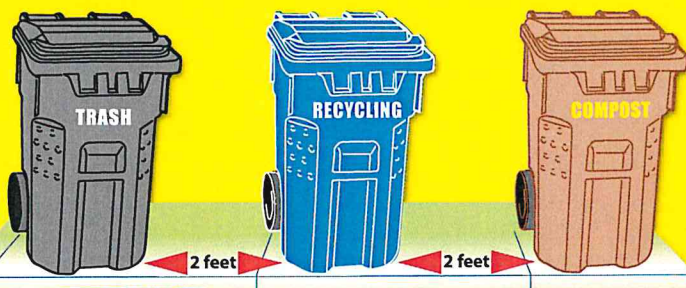
grass, leaves, branches (*up to 6" diameter*), brush & other plant debris, animal bedding, flowers, pumpkins, holiday greenery, unpainted/untreated wood (*less than 36" in length*)

PLEASE NOT IN COMPOST

- Plastic bags/wrap or straws
- Styrofoam
- Glass bottles & metal cans
- Aluminum foil/foil-lined food wrap
- Non-compostable wipes
- Diapers
- Liquids
- Hazardous waste
- Cat & dog waste/cat litter
- Rocks or dirt
- Painted wood

IMPORTANT

All items must be placed in the cart. When your cart is full, set it out by 6 am on your service day, at least 2 feet away from other carts and 4-6 feet from other objects, lid opens toward the street; cart handles should be away from the street.



Container colors may vary in your area.

NO HAZARDOUS WASTE such as automotive fluids, pesticides and fertilizers, paint products, cleaners, batteries, etc. For safe and legal disposal of hazardous waste, see page 14.

Mandatory Commercial Recycling & Composting
As part of California's efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and reach a 75% recycling rate by 2020, recycling is now mandatory for all large businesses and apartment complexes. Mandatory composting started in 2016 for large generators of food scraps/other organics. 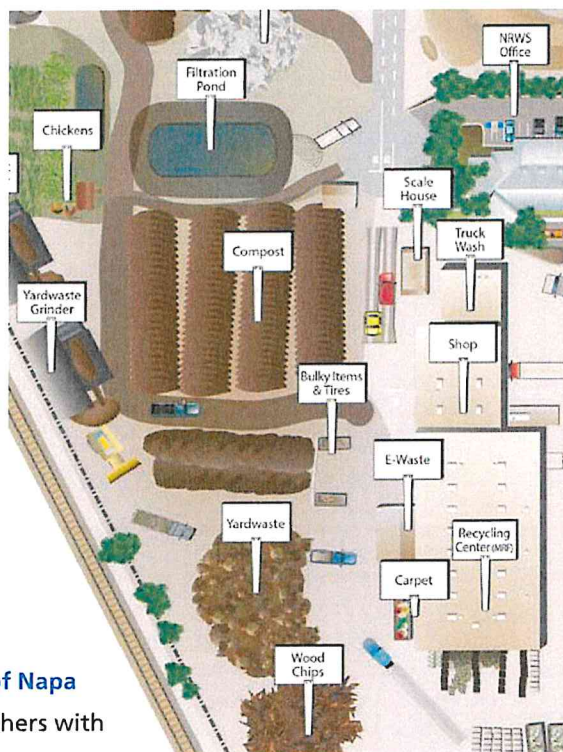
What happens to your recyclables and compostables after you put them in your curbside carts?

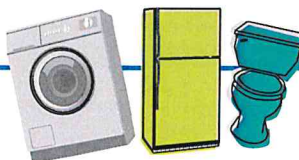

Appliance Efficiency Incentives

CLOTHES WASHERS High-efficiency residential clothes washers use less than 18 gallons of water per load, saving more than 50% in water and energy costs. Most area cities are participating in the **2017 Bay Area Residential High-Efficiency Clothes Washer Rebate Program**, which offers a rebate of \$100 for the purchase and installation of Energy Star Most Efficient models. Local clothes washer retailers have the application and qualifying product list. For more information, visit www.thinkinggreenconsultants.com or call 855-512-1221. For commercial clothes washers, City of Napa businesses and apartment complexes can take advantage of a \$400 Smart Rebate on high-efficiency machines. Details available at www.cityofnapa.org/water.

REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS & ROOM AIR CONDITIONERS Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) customers may qualify for a rebate by recycling old refrigerators, freezers and room air conditioners. Refrigerators or freezers must be at least 10-30 cubic feet each, empty and working. There is a limit of two units per household per year. The pick-up service is free. Qualifying customers may receive a rebate in 6-8 weeks for each unit. Funding is limited. For details or to schedule an appointment: visit www.pge.com/res/rebates or call 800-299-7573.

TOILETS City of Napa water customers can take advantage of generous financial incentives to replace pre-1992 water-wasting toilets (3.5 or more gallons per flush) with today's high-efficiency toilets, some of which use as little as 1 gallon per flush. Visit www.cityofnapa.org/water or www.napasan.com for details on current programs, or call the City of Napa's Water Conservation Representative at 707-257-9497. Commercial customers may obtain Smart Rebates from the City of Napa for high-efficiency toilets and urinals.

City of American Canyon will reimburse up to \$100 for every qualifying standard toilet removed and replaced with a high-efficiency toilet. Call the City of American Canyon's Sustainability Coordinator at 707-647-5327 for more details, as well as info about free low-flow shower heads and sink aerators..

City of Calistoga will reimburse water customers up to \$100 for replacement of a pre-1992 (3.5gpf) toilet with a EPA WaterSense labeled toilet using 1.28gpf or less — maximum two rebates per household. Water customers may obtain free high efficiency shower heads, sink aerators, toilet tank bags, garden hose nozzles, and other water conserving fixtures by contacting the Calistoga Public Works Department at 707-942-2828.

BUYBACK & DROP-OFF LOCATIONS



California Beverage Container Recycling Program

Glass, aluminum & plastic beverage containers labeled **CRV** (California Refund Value) can be redeemed at designated centers for:

- 5¢ per container under 24 oz
- 10¢ per container 24 oz and above.

Recycling centers are allowed to pay by weight as a matter of business efficiency, however California law allows the option of being paid based on count for up to 50 containers of each material type.

Non-CRV glass, metal and plastic beverage containers are accepted for recycling at most drop-off recycling locations.

Who owns your recyclables?

Recyclable materials at your workplace or home belong to you. You may choose to take your cans and bottles to a recycling buyback center or put your recyclables in the recycling equipment provided by your service provider for regularly scheduled pickup.

Once those materials are in the recycling cart or bin, only you or your service provider have the right to remove them. The recyclables have value, and the revenue your service provider receives from processing recyclables is taken into consideration when garbage collection rates are set.





RECYCLING AT SPECIAL EVENTS

Look for recycling containers at fairs, concerts or other public events!

**Want to recycle at YOUR event?
Resources are available to help you succeed.**

During the planning process, call NRWS at 707-255-5200 (*south county*) or 707-259-8330 for Up-Valley. They will help you select the right recycling, composting and trash containers for your needs and provide guidelines for successful event recycling.

State and County policies require recycling at large events. Plus, recycling will save you money because there is no charge for recycling at large events (*south county and north county free services vary*) ... while there is always a charge for trash collection.

✓ PLAN FOR RECYCLING

- Include a plan for recycling as you organize your event.
- Recycle, compost and trash containers should always be together.
- Proper placement and signage for all containers is key.
- Have cleanup staff monitor containers throughout the event. Paying for assistance during this critical time is a worthwhile investment.

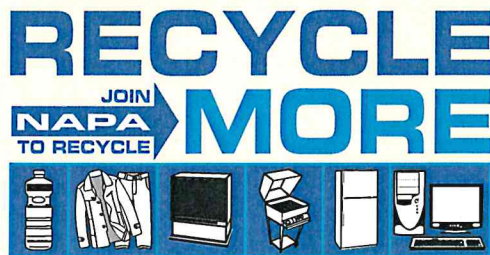

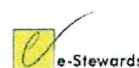

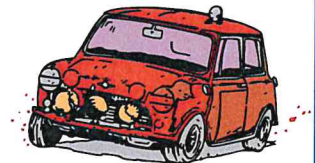

The Hazardous Waste Collection Facility is for safe and legal disposal of unusable or unwanted hazardous products. Please remember to pack products carefully so they won't mix or spill. Transport in trunk if possible. The facility accepts all types of hazardous waste except:
Radioactives • Explosives • Ammunition.

For highway safety, there is a legal limit of 15 gallons or 125 pounds of hazardous waste per trip.

Households: No appointments or fees for use • **Businesses:** Appointment only; fees charged

Protect your business and employees by disposing of unwanted, unused, and out-of-date hazardous waste properly.

REDUCE TOXIC WASTE



Is your unwanted product in good condition?

Could it be used by someone else? Don't let it sit on your shelf! At the Hazardous Waste Collection Facility they'll decide if your product can go to the "Reuse Locker" where someone else can use it up instead of wasting it.

Unwanted hazardous waste is very expensive to dispose. A better option for both your budget and the environment is to prevent the "waste" from the start.

- 1) **Buy the right product for the job.** There is no magic bullet! What do you want the product to do?
- 2) **Buy the least toxic alternative.** To minimize negative impacts to people/pets/the environment.
- 3) **Buy only the amount you need or can use up.** Will you be able to use up the "jumbo" or "bargain" size product before the expiration date?
- 4) **Store the product properly so it doesn't become unusable.** Keep in a covered, dry, safe place.



Paint Recycling PaintCare.org operates a paint stewardship program to ensure convenient locations for recycling paint product(s) including: interior and exterior house paints, deck coatings, primers, sealers, stains, shellacs, lacquers, varnishes, and urethanes. Deliver products in their original containers (5 gallon maximum) and a maximum of 20 gallons total per trip. **PLEASE CALL AHEAD to ensure the site has enough storage space to accommodate your paint.**

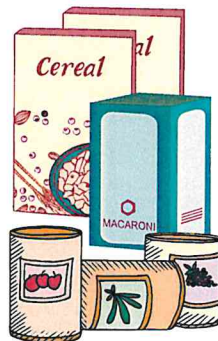

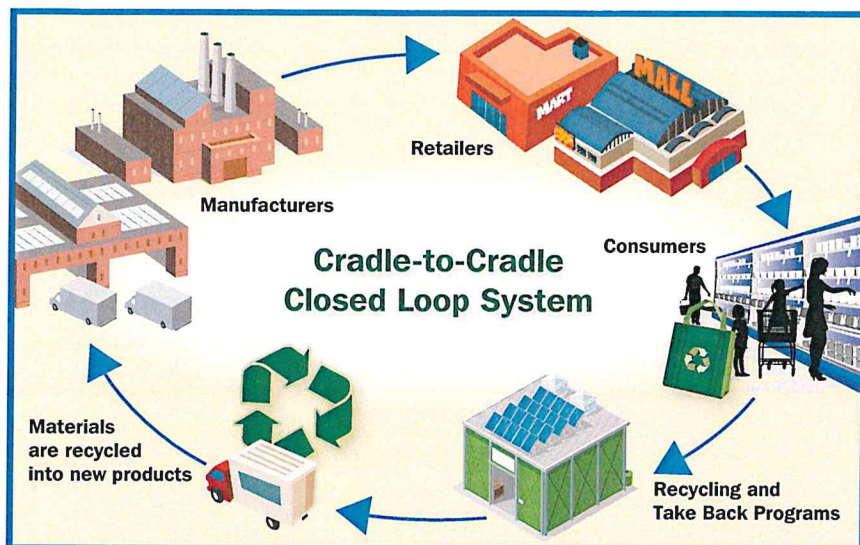

Benefits of Buying Recycled

- Reduce the extraction of virgin materials
- Save energy, decreasing the need for coal, oil or other non-renewable energy resources
- Create new enterprises, markets & jobs
- Reduce air and water pollutants; manufacturing with recycled materials is a much cleaner process
- Create a greater demand for manufacturers to use recycled materials
- Help California reach its mandated recycling goal of 75% and reach toward Zero Waste.

Examples of Products Made with Recycled Materials

Aluminum & other metals: appliances, cans, building materials, furniture

Glass: bottles, kitchenware, mosaics, tile flooring, fiberglass insulation

Laser & inkjet cartridges: refurbished cartridges

Paint: recycled content latex paint

Paper: office/printing paper, chipboard, cardboard, paper towels, toilet paper, tissues, insulation, hydraulic mulch (*usually mixed with seed for highways*), absorbents

PET plastics (*clear bottles*): bottles, tote bags, t-shirts, office products, fleece jackets, blankets, athletic wear, carpet, automotive parts

Plastics: poly-wood (*decking*), playground equipment, picnic tables, planter boxes, office materials, landscaping materials (e.g. lawn edging, fence posts, garden hose), bins & buckets, street barricades & cones, carpet, paint

Textiles: canvas bags, t-shirts, polo shirts, absorbents

Tires: flooring, floor mats, walking paths, shoes, mousepads, roofing, soil enhancements, tires (2%-6%), arena footing

Used cooking oil: biodiesel

Used motor oil: re-refined motor oil

Yard trimmings, food scraps & wood: wood chips, compost & mulch, topsoil, absorbents, renewable fuel



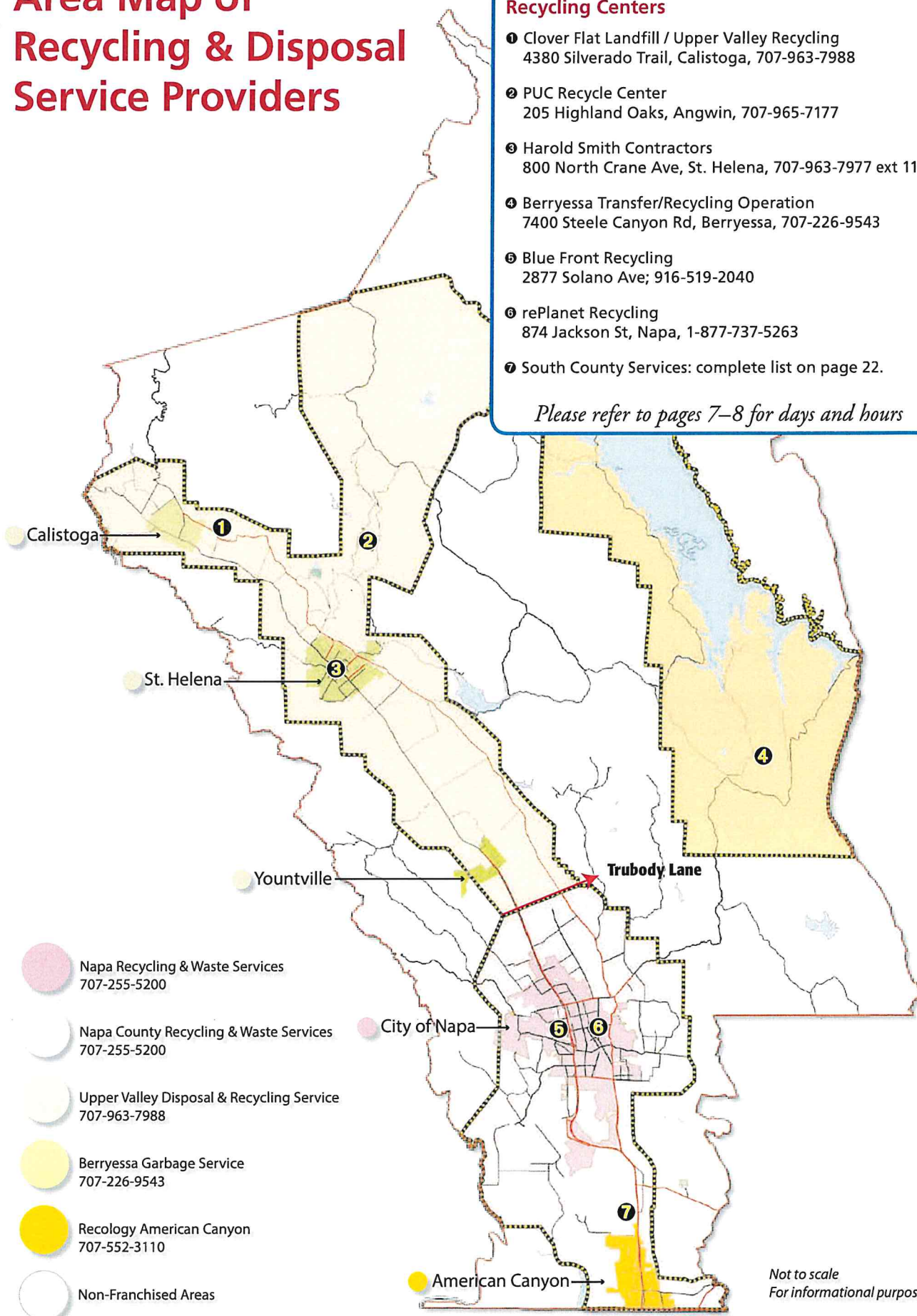

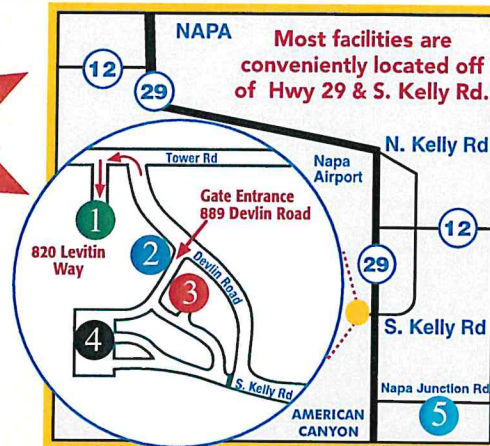
